### THE ANNUAL REPORT OF THE SOCIETY TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDING 31 AUGUST 2009



The trustees present their report and accounts for the year ended 31 August 2009. The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the accounts and comply with the Society's constitution, the Charities Act 1993 and the Statement of Recommended Practice, "Accounting and Reporting by Charities", issued in March 2005.

#### Structure, governance and management

The Alpine Garden Society (AGS) was founded in 1929, with the aim of promoting an interest in all aspects of alpine plants, their cultivation in rock gardens and plant conservation in natural habitats. It is a membership organisation, registered with the Charity Commission and is governed by its constitution and rules adopted 4 November 1966. The trustees who served during the year are listed on the Reference and Administrative Information page. The Charity has a governing body comprising 23 Trustees; 8 of these are Officers who are elected annually. serving for a potential maximum of ten years. Of the remaining 15, five are replaced annually with five new elected members who serve for a three-year period. Vacant Trustee and Officer positions are advertised in the Society's Newsletter that is circulated to all members. Nominations are invited and the names of nominated candidates, together with supporting statements, are published in the Society Newsletter. If there are more nominations than vacancies, a vote is taken by secret ballot at the AGM. Casual vacancies that arise may be filled by co-option. An annual Induction Day is organized for all newly elected Trustees and Officers (and they are provided with a list of Trustees' duties and responsibilities, the Charity Commission 'Good Trustee Guide', together with the Society's 'Code of Conduct' for Trustees). The governing body is known as the 'Main Committee' upon which all Trustees (Excluding Custodian Trustees) serve. It is chaired by the President of the Society. The overall strategy and policy of the Charity is set by 'Main Committee'. There are also a number of sub-committees who deal with various aspects of the Charity's activities and those of the subsidiary trading companies. All sub-committees report to the 'Main Committee'. In addition 'Main Committee', from time to time, establishes working parties to pursue special projects such as educational conferences and

displays. The sub-committees of the Society are as follows - Finance, Seed, Shows, Publications and Tours. The Finance sub-committee usually meets three times per year, Publications, Seed and Tours, twice yearly, with Shows only meeting once a year. The Society has 52 Affiliated Local Groups spread around the UK with whom it corresponds on a regular basis. Support is offered to the Groups in the form of insurance, awards and medals, grants to assist with the cost of speakers, printing of programmes. assistance with mail shots to members etc. Members of the Society are also allowed to join any of its three Specialist Groups that were established to focus on particular activities. These three Specialist Groups comprise 'The Fritillaria Group', 'The Androsace Group' and 'The History of Rock and Alpine Gardening Study Group'. The Fritillaria Group and Androsace Group produce a separate Newsletter for their members, organize their own seed exchange scheme, together with lectures on their specialist subject. The History Group arranges annual meetings at different locations around the UK with visits to relevant gardens.

The Charity employs four staff (three full-time and one part-time) who deal with the administration of the Charity and its Limited Companies. They also assist with various aspects of the Charity's wider activities. The Society Director is an ex-officio member of the Main Committee and all sub-committees and is responsible for the implementation of the policies laid down by these committees. In addition to overseeing the administration of the Charity and its subsidiary companies, she gives guidance and advice to Officers and Trustees on governance issues. She is also Company Secretary to the limited companies.

The Society carries on some of its trading activities through two wholly owned subsidiary companies - AGS

Publications Limited and AGS Expeditions Limited. These effectively run the operation of special publications and tours on behalf of the Society. A third company, namely AGS Seed Distribution Limited, was closed at the end of last year and its activities transferred to the Charity. The management of the remaining companies is controlled by directors, namely the President, the Treasurer and the relevant officer for each company, together with the three Society Custodian Holding Trustees as Shareholders, and they are answerable to the Society's Main

#### Committee.

The trustees have assessed the major risks to which the Society is exposed, and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate exposure to the major risks.

#### **Objectives and activities**

The Society's objects are set out in Clause I of the Constitution, namely to:

- · further knowledge of alpine plants
- encourage the cultivation of the plants
- gather and disseminate particulars of their cultivation and conditions under which they grow in nature and by
- means of a quarterly Bulletin and other special publications
- · hold shows of alpine plants
- · give advice on any matters concerning these plants
- · arrange tours and visits; organise meetings
- · promote the formations of local groups
- generally undertake any activities that shall be consistent with the purpose for which the Society is constituted.

The trustees have paid due regard to guidance issued by the Charity Commission in deciding what activities the Society should undertake. A number of educational garden exhibits were staged at public events, such as the RHS Chelsea Flower Show, Harrogate Spring Flower Show and Southport Flower Show. The charity has staged 25 alpine plant shows at venues around the country that are open to the public, some of which featured practical demonstrations. Workshops were organized on various topics such as 'Websites for Local Groups', and 'Managing Digital Plant Photographs'. These were mainly held at the Society headquarters in Pershore but some demonstrations are also staged at Society Shows. The charity produced its quarterly journal and Newsletter. It has also further expanded the range of titles in its series of information leaflets. Under the auspices of its two limited companies the charity organized a number of plant related tours in addition to publishing new specialist alpine book publications, including one particularly aimed at the beginner. The Society's seed exchange scheme has continued to distribute seed to a large proportion of the membership, as well as making seed available to the general public. The bi-annual meeting with Show Secretaries took place in late November 2008 and was well attended.

The facility for members to join and renew their membership on-line, together with the facility to purchase specialist books has continued to be successful. It is intended to widen this facility in the forthcoming year to enable on-line ordering of seed. The Society's 'on-line flower show' initiative again showed an increase in

entries over the preceding year. The Society has embarked upon an extensive redesign of certain areas of its garden at Pershore. A series of travel awards and grants were awarded to further the study of alpine plants. Trophies were also presented to individuals in recognition of their contribution to the world of alpine plants. The Society continued with its programme for a phased replacement of Custodian (Holding) Trustees and a new Custodian Trustee was appointed at its AGM in 2008. During the year the charity has benefited from the work and advice of many volunteers, without whom the charity could not meet its charitable objectives. The value of the work is unquantifiable and as such no attempt has been made to provide for this work in the accounts. The Committee wishes to express their thanks to all the volunteers who have contributed to the success of the charity in the past twelve months. All of the society's activities are focused on promoting an interest in all aspects of alpine plants, their cultivation in rock gardens and plant conservation in natural habitats. There is unrestricted access to our services. In consequence the activities deliver a public benefit.

#### Achievements and performance

The charity allocated additional funds to extend the length of its quarterly publication. This has enabled a wider selection of informative articles to be included, together with a larger number of colour illustrations. In 2009 the charity was again awarded the RHS Holford Medal for its Gold Medal winning display in 2008 at the RHS Chelsea Flower Show. It also received a 'Premier Award' for a garden exhibit at the Harrogate Spring Flower Show in 2009.

Recruitment of new members has risen slightly. The Society has continued to develop its website as a

repository of information on alpine plants. The Society has continued to reduce some of its reserves in a planned way by making funds available for specific projects through application to its Development Fund.

#### **Financial review**

During the year the charity had consolidated incoming resources totalling £474,258 (2008 £460,685), of which £146500 (2008 £145494) was from membership subscriptions. Total consolidated resources expended for the year were £536,507 (2008 £503,610), giving net outgoing resources of £62,249 (2008 £42,925). Losses on investment assets during the year of £189,403 resulted in a net decline in total funds of £251,652, leaving total reserves at £2,217,627. It is the policy of the Society that unrestricted funds which have not been designated for a specific use (ie general funds) should be maintained at a level equivalent to between six and twelve month's expenditure. The trustees considers that reserves at this level will ensure that, in the event of a significant drop in funding, they will be able to continue the Society's current activities while consideration is given to ways in which additional funds may be raised. This level of reserves has been maintained throughout the year.

The committee have power, from time to time, after taking advice from a Member of the London Stock Exchange, to direct the holding trustees concerned to invest the funds of the Society or any part thereof in any way which, in its absolute discretion, thinks fit, in all respects as if it were a sole Beneficial Owner of such funds notwithstanding that such investments may not be investments authorised by law for the investment of funds, and the committee shall have power, from time to time, to direct the holding trustees to vary or transpose such investments. The holding trustees may also enter into arrangements for the provision of investment management services by stockbrokers, merchant banks and/or suitably qualified investments managers (which may include power for such managers to make specific investment decisions under general policy guidelines laid down form time to time by the committee) to vary or change such arrangements and to pay reasonable charges for such services out of the Society's income. The investments held by the AGS have continued to perform well during the past year. Investments are UK Government Fixed Interest Bonds, UK Unit Trusts and shares in subsidiary companies. The market value of the investments has decreased in the year by £189,403, and is included in unrealised gains.

#### Plans for the future

The charity intends to continue with its regular activities in pursuit of its Objectives such as organizing shows, tours, travel awards and grants, educational exhibits (especially at major national and regional shows), workshops, seed exchange scheme and publication of its quarterly journal 'The Alpine Gardener'. In addition the charity intends to continue to expand its repository of information on alpine plants by adding to its series of Information Leaflets. More new books on alpine plants are to be published by AGS Publications Ltd. Plans are in hand to expand on-line ordering on its website in relation to the seed exchange scheme, as well as undertaking a redesign of the entire website. The Society is also to produce a second DVD containing back issues of its quarterly journal covering the period 1943 to 1953 and this will be made freely available to members. The Society is pursuing its plans to host further conferences on alpine plants. The first is due to take place in September 2009 on a theme of woodland plants. A second, much larger international conference on alpine plants is being planned for 2011. Further redevelopment work will continue in the garden at Pershore. A meeting with representatives from the Society's local groups is scheduled for November 2009.

### SPRING BULBS OF PARNASSOS AND THE PELOPONNESE

### 31 March - 14 April 2010 (15 days) Leaders: Margaret & David Thorne Cost: circa £1,200

Springtime in Greece brings a kaleidoscope of glorious flowers. Fields full of poppies, anemones, mayweeds, spurges, crown daisies, corn marigolds and many more species, create a colourful roadside spectacle.

Our botanical exploration will start in the south of the Peloponnese, on the Mani Peninsula, a scenically beautiful area where Tulipa goulimyi, Fritillaria davisii and Teucrium brevifolium are local endemics.



Here we will also find Cyclamen peloponnesiacum on woodland edges, both Cerinthe major and C.retorta and a fascinating range of orchids. Among the most showy of these are Orchis papilionacea, O.pauciflora and Ophrys speculum, but good displays are likely of O.tenthredinifera, O.spruneri, O.bombyliflora and the local endemic, O.argolica. Some spikes of Himantoglossum robertianum, the Giant Orchid, will still be at their best and there will be plenty of opportunity to identify several species of Serapias.

On the Malea peninsula, we will visit the impressive rock of Monemvasia and its well documented floral treasures including Campanula andrewsii, Onosma frutescens and Procopiana cretica. A nearby area of acid soils is characterised by Arbutus unedo, Erica arborea and Lavandula stoechas, with Dactylorhiza romana and Romulea bulbocodium. A roadside terrace has vivid red Papaver apulum with black and white throat markings and clumps of Ophrys lutea and O.iricolor. Further north, we will find red Tulipa undulatifolia, orange T.orphanidea, good populations of Fritillaria graeca ssp guicciardii with distinctive



bicoloured flowers, Cyclamen peloponnesiacum ssp vividum and Anemone blanda in blue and white forms.

During the latter part of the Tour, we visit Mounts Chelmos and Parnassos, and the surrounding areas for Crocus sieberi ssp sublimis, C.olivieri, Iris attica, Daphne jasminea, Leontice leontopetalum, Ophrys cornuta and other local specialities.

There will be visits to Ancient Sites including Mystras, Delphi and perhaps Epidavros, Mycenae and Sounion. Flights will be from London to Athens and accommodation in comfortable hotels. Transport is by small coach enabling us all to travel together and in comfort, while having access to narrow roads in areas of interest.

## EVEREST'S ALPINES, TIBET

#### 10 July - 6 August (28 DAYS) Leaders: Margaret & David Thorne Cost: circa £3.500

his Tour extends the scope of AGS's botanical investigations in Tibet, as our visit will be slightly later than in 2005 and includes some new areas of exploration. Its highlight will once again be the Everest Kangshung Face Trek, a circular route at the foot of Makalu and Everest. Our time spent camping will be fully supported by a trekking crew and yaks

carrying our luggage. We cross the Shao La into the Karma Valley, a richly forested area described by George Mallory as 'one of the most beautiful valleys in the world' and return to the Kharta Valley over the Tour's highest pass, the Langma La (5347 masl).

#### To acclimatise before the trek, we will botanise in the hills around Lhasa and eastwards to the Mi La (5050 masl) near Rutok - for Corydalis milarepa and many other exquisite plants. We will also visit the magnificent Potala Palace, the Dalai Lama's childhood home, and the Jokhang, Tibetan Buddhism's most sacred monastery. Our journey along the Friendship Highway between Lhasa and Kharta will include several stops to botanise at passes over 5000 masl and the return drive to Kathmandu will present opportunities to experience a wide range of other new landscapes and habitats.

We expect to see many of the 800 species found in 2005 including Meconopsis tibetica and 2 others new to science, and perhaps some later flowering additions.

There will be a good selection of scree plants: Saussurea, Soroseris, Cremanthodium, Eriophyton and Corydalis as well as cushion of Androsace, Arenaria, Chionocharis, Saxifraga and Waldheimia. Other well represented Genera are Gentiana, Leontopodium, Meconopsis, Rhodiola, Rhododendron, Pedicularis, Potentilla and Primula.

The Tour will be limited to 20 members including leaders and should only be contemplated by the adventurous and fit, as it involves some long walking days and camping at nearly 5000 masl.

The cost of the Tour includes all flights, land transportation by coach and 4 wheel drive vehicles, sightseeing fees, the trek, accommodation, and food apart from lunches and dinners in Kathmandu. Although we know of no reason why access to Tibet should be a problem in 2010, a substitute Everest Trek in Nepal will be offered should the unexpected occur.

## Narcissi of Iberia & Morocco 25th February – 10th March 2010

#### Cost £2195 (Ground Only Cost £1995)

Leaders: Ian Bennallick, Paul Green and Stefano Doglio

tour designed to see the majority of Iberian and Northern Moroccan Narcissi that bloom in early spring. We start in mid Portugal where drifts of Narcissus asturiensis and Crocus carpetanus colour the mountains. There's golden Narcissus gaditanus as well as Narcissus calcicola, Narcissus obesus and fine stands of elegant Narcissus triandrus. Moving south into Andalucia we'll encounter Narcissus assoanus and endemic Narcissus cuatrecasasii, Narcissus minor is plentiful in Spanish Fir forests and in the Sierra de Alcaparain is ghostly Narcissus cantabricus. Narcissus bulbocodium, Narcissus cordubensis and Narcissus ionguilla adorn meadows dotted with cork oaks. We'll cross the Straits of Gibraltar to the Parc Nacional de Talassemtane in the Rif Mountains of Northern Morocco. Based in picturesque Chefchaouen we'll explore these verdant mountains, home to huge-flowered Paeonia coriacea and drifts of confusing Romuleas. The albidus subspecies of Narcissus romeiuxii is common and we'll look for golden Narcissus rupicola and rare Narcissus albimarginatus. Throughout the tour we'll see plenty of other fine flowers including Dipcadis, Raffenaldias, Iris planifolia, Two-leaved Gennaria and many other orchids, Fritillaria lusitanica, fabulous Linarias and the bizarre flowers of Arisarum simmorhinum

## Tulips of Tien Shan 10th – 23rd April 2010

## Cost £2470 (Ground Only Cost £1970)

Korgalzhyn Steppe Extension

### 23rd - 27th April Cost £1095

A truly remarkable display of colourful tulips carpet Southern Kazakhstan Ain Spring. Chief among them are the magnificent goblets of Greig's Tulip which come in an unforgettable pageant of reds, oranges and yellows. Tulipa kaufmanniana adorns the lower slopes of the Mountains of Heaven, while swathes of multi-coloured Tulipas ostrowskiana and kolpakowskiana shine in the crystal clear air of these Central Asian Mountains. Rarities such as Tulipa borszczowii, Tulipa buhseana, Tulipa binutans and lovely Tulipa zenaidae are among sixteen species of Tulip on this tour. Fritillary-like Korolkovia severzovii and Rhinopetalum stenantherum, with their strangely-coloured bells, mix with bright yellow Anemones and a wide variety of colourful Corydalis species. By patches of snow are the white stars of Crocus alatavicus and along with half a dozen species of Iris is the many-hued Iridodictyum kolpakovskianum. Bird migration will be in full swing. Flocks of up to a thousand Demoiselle Cranes will be a fantastic sight. Sometimes we encounter Isabelline Brown Bears and more certainly we'll see Siberian Ibex and the globally endangered Arkhar. An extension takes us to the famed Korgalzhyn steppes where Tulipa schrenkii's predominantly yellow blooms are mixed with rose-red, pink and white forms that stretch to the horizon in an unforgettable pastiche.





## Autumn in Yunnan 16th – 30th September 2010

### Cost £3195 (Ground Only Cost £2565)

Vunnan has many stunning autumn flowers, in particular its unparalleled Gentians. Amid the fast-colouring autumnal hues of the Zhongdian Plateau are marvellous displays of Gentiana sino-ornata and stripe-tubed veitchiorum smothering acres of marshes and dry slopes respectively. By the alpine Tianchi Lake grows Gentiana arethusae and on the high turf of the Baima Shan are great spreads of pale blue Gentiana hexaphylla and perhaps the dazzling deep blue Gentiana emergens. However, not all is blue as we will seek out the remarkable climbing gentian-relative Crawfurdia campanulacea with pink and white striped bells in the seldom visited Zibenshan and further towards the Burmese border is another species Crawfurdia angustata which grows alongside elegant Aconitum nagarum. Indeed Monkshoods are a prominent genus at this season with species such as stout Aconitum forrestii, the dwarf alpine pulchellum, climbing delavayi and near black brevicalcaratum. The autumn picture is completed with Cyananthus, Delphinium and members of the bizarre genus Saussurea such as leucoma, medusa and heiracioides on the high wild screes of the Baima Shan.




## Bulbs of Jordan 8th – 17th January 2011

### Cost £1980 (Ground Only Cost £1580)

Leaders: Chris Gardner and Başak Gardner

orming the eastern margin of the deep rift that descends to over a Thousand feet below sea level on the shores of the Dead Sea are the mountains of Western lordan, an area with a rich and distinctive flora set amid stunning landscapes. Surrounding the hilltop villages are terraces which in the cool of the desert winter host abundant bulbous species, most notably Crocuses. We'll see elegant Crocus aleppicus, lots of Crocus hyemalis and Crocus cancellatus, newly described Crocus nagabensis and the lovely Crocus moabiticus. Colchicums are varied too and include Colchicum ritchii, Colchicum heirosolymitana and Colchicum brachyphyllum. We'll visit a number of lordan's archaeological sites, most of them excellent areas for flowers, and in particular magnificent Petra, one of the world's most superlative historical sites. The beautiful sandstone mountains surrounding Petra are peppered with Biarums and the simply stunning purple-etched white blooms of the rare juno Iris edomensis. Delicate Bellevalia desertorum blooms with Androcymbium palaestinum and we'll look for Iris postii and near Salt, the rare and beautiful Iris vartanii.
