## **Photographic Display Boards**

### TREASURER'S REPORT ON THE SOCIETY'S CONSOLIDATED ACCOUNTS A parden society



#### General

The Consolidated Accounts include the combined income and expenditure accounts of the parent Society (the Alpine Garden Society) and its two subsidiary companies (AGS Publications Ltd and AGS Expeditions Ltd.) The full version of the Consolidated Accounts has been approved by Main Committee and will be sent to the Charity Commission in fulfilment of the Society's statutory obligations. In line with a previous decision made by the Society's Annual General Meeting (AGM), only a summarised version comprising the Statement of Financial Activities and the Consolidated Balance Sheet is presented to the AGM but will also be made more widely available in the Society's Newsletter and on its website. Any member interested in seeing a full set of the accounts may obtain one by making written application to the Society's Director.

Comments that follow relate to items in the full accounts and their accompanying notes where significant variations occur compared to the previous year or where attention is otherwise drawn to particular noteworthy features. If small differences occur between the comparative figures for 2008/2009 in these accounts and those published previously for that year, these may be due to late submission of information or the re-classification of sums by category.

The Society is grateful to its independent auditors. Messrs Kendall Wadley LLP, for preparation of the accounts and for advice.

#### 2.Statement of Financial Activities for the Year Ended 31 August 2010

#### 2.1 Incoming Resources

The total incoming resources for 2009/2010 amounted to £639,681, a significant increase over £474,258 last year. This is largely explained by legacies received (£164,268 compared with none in 2008/2009.) One of the legacies received has been placed in a restricted fund due to the terms of the bequest. The Society is immensely grateful to those individuals who have made donations or have remembered the AGS in their wills.

There has been little change in the income received from subscriptions (£145,600 in 2009/2010; £146,500 in 2008/2009.)

Income from investments is down (£61,079 against £81,462), which is partly due to the fact that some investments were sold during the year and legacies received were not available for investment until recently.

Trading income for AGS Expeditions Ltd was £170,617 (£136,041 in 2008/2009) and for AGS Publications Ltd was £45,052 (£48,861 in 2008/2009.) A total of £8,152 was contributed to the Society under deeds of covenant by these subsidiary companies (£17,107 in 2008/2009.)

#### 2.2 Resources Expended

At £610,867, the total resources expended in 2009/2010 showed an increase over the figure of £536,507 for 2008/2009. Part of this increase is accounted for by the expenditure of the two trading companies (£204,587 compared with £167,796 in 2008/2009.) Other parts are spread over a variety of activities, for example covering the loss on a conference and making more awards and prizes. Staff costs were £106,177 compared with £104,251 in 2008/2009.

#### 2.3 Net (Outgoing)/Incoming/ Resources for the Year

An excess of £28,814 has been recorded for this year compared with a deficit of £62,249 last year. This is mainly due to the legacies received.

#### 2.4 Other Recognised Gains and Losses

A revaluation of trophies and medals during this year has identified an increase in their value by £32,363.

Some recovery has occurred in the nominal paper value of the Society's investments and a profit was made on investments sold; together these amount to £39.965

#### 2.5 Net movement in Funds and Fund Balances at 31 August 2010

The value of the Society's assets increased by £101,142 (4.56%) over the year and now stands at a total of £2.318.769.

### 3. Consolidated Balance Sheet as at 31 August 2010

This shows the make-up of the Society's current assets and liabilities. Fixed assets (£290,578) include the value of the lease on the Society's Headquarters Building, the fixtures and fittings therein, and its trophies, medals and library. A very small increase (0.56%) is shown in the value of the Society's investments.

Of the £78,591 held in stock, most can be attributed to publications. The amount due from debtors (£41,569) includes prepayments and income receivable but not physically received in the bank account (£17,500 of investment income held by the brokers falls into the latter category.) Cash at the bank is a high figure compared with last year because it includes legacy income waiting to be invested – simply a matter of timing!

The amount falling due to creditors (£117,698) is significantly larger than last year (£45,401) because approximately £75,000 has been received from delegates towards the 2011 Conference; this will appear as income in next year's accounts - after the Conference has been held.

The section on Income Funds shows the breakdown between Restricted, Designated and Other Funds.

#### 4. Financial Strategy

As indicated in last year's report, it had become apparent that, as membership numbers were falling, current members' subscriptions have been subsidised by Society income that should more properly be spent on the Society's charitable objectives. An analysis was therefore undertaken, involving several long-standing AGS members, into the most appropriate apportionment of categories of expenditure according to the proportion to which they could be said to be of benefit primarily to current members or were more clearly supporting the longer term health and sustainability of the Society. This analysis has resulted in the decision to increase membership subscriptions by £3.00 per annum for most categories with effect from I January 2011. Unless membership numbers also increase, however, that will solve only half of the problem. In addition, expenditure needs to be re-balanced according to sources of income. To give but one example, too often in the past legacies have simply

been absorbed into the general running costs of the Society. This has led to successive deficits on the annual income and expenditure account being tolerated too readily. However, it is questionable whether those who make bequests really intended the funds to dribble away in this fashion rather than be put to a more concrete purpose. Also, the unpredictable timing and quantity of legacies should preclude them being relied upon to contribute to balancing the budget. Consequently, approval has been given to the establishment of a Major Projects Fund, into which will be channelled all legacies of more than £5000 (unless there are specific stipulations in the terms of the bequest.)

The Major Projects Fund will supplement the existing Development Fund, though the latter will in future receive its money from current income when this can be afforded. Past allocations from the Development Fund have included sums for the re-design of the Society's database, development of the website, additional pages in the Bulletin, digitisation of the slide collection and items of equipment for some Local Groups.

The two subsidiary companies form an important part of the Society's activities and, as can be seen from these and previous annual accounts, are often able to covenant money from their profits back to the AGS. However, from time to time they are dependent upon loans from the Society to facilitate their various projects before receiving income from sales or tours. Hitherto, these loans have been free of interest but our understanding is that this is no longer permissible and a rate of interest akin to the prevailing market rate will in future have to be charged.

#### 5. Conclusion

Overall, the accounts show that the Society is in a healthy state, though the inherent imbalance between regular income and levels of expenditure has been masked, as often in the past, by an unusual (and most welcome) influx of legacies. If the quality and volume of services and activities enjoyed by members is to be sustained, particularly in the longer term, there would appear to be few solutions other than to overcome the lack of commitment by the current membership as a whole to the recruitment of new members.

## Post Conference Tour to Parnassos and the northern Greek Peloponnese

29th April-May 9th 2011

We are delighted to offer this eleven-day tour to Parnassos and the northern Greek Peloponnese, to be led by John Richards, former President of the Alpine Garden Society and author of Mountain Flower Walks – The Greek Mainland, published by the AGS.

The tour starts on April 29th 2011 at the magical town of Delphi, 'navel of the world', on the lower slopes of Parnassos. Beautiful plants occur on walls throughout the town, and we shall visit Daphne jasminea in its most accessible site. Driving up the mountain on good roads we shall see Tulipa australis, Bellevalia ciliata, Iris attica, three crocuses, three corydalis, two fritilaries and quantities of other bulbs. Delphi is a good orchid site and we will visit the ruins.

Driving to the Peloponnese, we aim to stay in the small town of Kalyvrita, and then move on to a superb hotel at Zarouchia, close to the source of the Styx. In this region, Cyclamen peloponnesianum and Asperula arcadiensis are widespread, and many rare alpines are washed down the Styx onto river gravels. Bulbs and alpines high on Chelmos are rich, and we will see Crocus sieberi 'tricolor', C. olivieri, Colchicum triphyllum, Gymnospermum albertii and much else. One excursion will take us to see the almost mythical Adonis cyllenea and we will visit the lake and ancient monastery of Pheneos. On the way to our last stop in the beautiful Venetian port of Nafplio we shall take in the little-known and superb ancient site of Nemea, full of orchids, and visit a site for the little-known Biarum spruneri.





#### INDIAN HIMALAYAS

his Tour comprises two treks, both in scenically stunning and botanically rewarding locations in the Indian Himalayas. After 8 days exploring the Rupin and Nalgan Passes above the Baspa Valley, north-east of Shimla, we drive via the Jalori Pass to a comfortable hotel in Manali. From here we visit the Rohtang Pass by Land Cruiser, then trek for 4 days over the Hampta Pass. We follow in the footsteps of Henry and Margaret Taylor who have thoroughly explored all these areas, documented them well in past AGS and SRGC Journals and provided much valuable advice before we reconnoitred the Tour.

We expect to see all the exciting species described in the Taylors' articles which include Androsace, Arenaria, Cardiocrinum, Corydalis, Cremanthodium, Iris, Lilium, Pedicularis, Potentilla, Primula, Rhodiola, Rhododendron, Saussurea, Saxifraga, Waldheimia and a good selection of orchids.

The Tour will be limited to 20 members including leaders and should only be contemplated by the adventurous and fit, as it involves some long walking days to a maximum altitude of 5030m, and camping above 4000m.

The cost of the Tour includes all flights, land transportation by train (including the 'Toy Train' from Kolka to Shimla), coach and 4 wheel drive vehicles, the two treks, accommodation, and food apart from lunches and dinners in Delhi and Manali. A 2-day sightseeing extension, for visits to the Red Fort and Taj Mahal will be arranged at extra cost if there are sufficient members interested in this.

Adelboden is a picturesque, traditional, Swiss mountain village in the heart of the Bernese Oberland, and is an ideal centre for a relaxed summer alpine wild flower holiday.

This is an excellent venue for a first visit to the Alps, but will also appeal to those who enjoy visiting the mountains. We will experience the full range of alpine habitats including woodlands, wet and dry alpine pastures, screes and snowmelts. The walking will be at a relaxed pace, with plenty of opportunity to stop and look at the flora, and for those who wish, to photograph the flowers or scenery.

Included in the holiday is a "Wanderpass" which offers unlimited access to the excellent local network of cable cars and buses in the Adelboden area, taking us up to the upper alpine pastures and screes without the need for very long walks uphill.

All of our previous trips to this area have proved very enjoyable, with wonderful wild flowers and beautiful views, with plenty of butterflies and birds which will appeal to those with a broader natural history interest. We have found the Hotel Bristol welcoming, comfortable, and with good food. The hotel is very conveniently near to the village



centre, with the bus and cable car stations within 150 metres

We think you will enjoy this holiday if you like gentle day walks exploring for plants, particularly alpines, and would like to visit one of the lesser-known areas in this beautiful part of Switzerland, or have an interest in photography - but not necessarily all three!.

Each evening we will have the opportunity to discuss the finds of the day. Pete will also offer some informal photography sessions, and will share his photographic expertise, whatever your camera or experience.

#### Leaders and guides

Jackie and Pete Murray have a wealth of botanical knowledge and travel experience between them. They have led holidays for over 15 years.



Jackie is a keen alpine and snowdrop grower and shows alpine plants. She has been awarded an AGS Farrer Medal, and AGS Silver Medals in the growing and artistic (photographic) sections.

Pete is skilled in botanical photography and has gained AGS (artistic) and RHS gold medals for his photographs of alpines. He runs photographic courses for digital and film photographers at and near his home in west Lincolnshire.

Pete and Jackie have been visiting the Adelboden area for over 20 years, and have an extensive knowledge of the plant and photographic locations in these mountains.

#### **About the holiday**

We will begin our holiday by flying from London to Zurich and then transfer by coach to Adelboden.

The first plants will be seen having taken a short cable car ride to the alpine ridge behind the village. This offers panoramic views and a glimpse of many of the places we will visit during the week. The meadows are a patchwork of summer alpine flowers at this time, studded with Campanula barbata (in blue and white forms), and vivid blue Gentians. The track along the ridge has a botanical trail which is an ideal introduction to the flora, and on another day we will visit to the small mountainside botanic garden at Horeli. As we make use of the way-marked lanes and paths back to Adelboden, we will have fine views and can enjoy the summer pastoral scenes, the butterflies and birds, and look for the woodland orchids such as Epipactis and Neottia.

We will also venture higher to the screes and snowmelt areas. A short bus trip up the Boden valley and a cable car takes us to the upland basin of Engstligenalp, where we



will follow the tracks through the meadows ascending towards the Ammertenpass. Accompanied by the sound of cow bells we should find Primula farinosa, black-vanilla orchid, Nigretella nigra, Gentiana verna in the orchid rich meadows. Higher we will find Soldanella alpina and Ranunculus alpestris, R.aconitifolius and R.montanus around the snowmelts with a backdrop the snow capped Wildstrubel. There will be a chance to see Geum reptans and Thlaspe rotundifolium on the stabilised screes.

Our valley walks will also take us into the damper wooded areas where we should find Listera ovata and Parnassia palustris amongst many others. There will be time to botanise, take photographs of the spectacular waterfalls or just admire the wonderful scenery. Refreshment stops at 'mountain huts' may be taken when available.

#### Local transport

Transfers from and to the airport will be by coach (about I and a half hours each way). We will use our Wanderpass (included in the holiday price) to make full use of the excellent local transport, by cable car or bus, for our daily excursions.

#### **Accommodation & meals**

We stay at the excellent 3-star Hotel Bristol, situated in a quiet position but conveniently close to the centre of the traditional Swiss settlement of Adelboden. The hotel is renowned for its convivial atmosphere good food, with English speaking staff. Rooms have en-suite facilities with bath and/or shower. We will be staying on a half board basis which includes breakfast and evening meals at the hotel. Picnic lunches, for which items can be purchased in the town, will be taken on most days.

#### Fitness and health

We shall take full day excursions after a short cable car and or bus rides.

Our walks will be at a gentle pace, to enjoy and photograph the flowers or scenery. We shall use cable cars to reach most of the higher areas avoiding the need for long and arduous uphill climbs at the start of the day.

Walks will usually be on paths or areas adjacent to paths. You need to be reasonably sure-footed as it is necessary to walk on rougher ground to see the best of the flowers. The length of time spent walking will depend on the interests and wishes of the group, but most walks are circular or there and back. Walks are always adjusted according to the group and the prevailing weather conditions. Lengths of walks will differ from day to day, with cable car return options, and a length up to 5 to 6 miles maximum. Full waterproofs (Gortex/breathable) and walking boots will be required for our mountain excursions.

Please note that we shall be at high altitude. Adelboden is at 4500' and our excursions are up to 10,000'. While most people will experience no problem at all with this, those with any breathing or heart conditions must consult their doctor before making a booking.

You will need a day rucksack to carry full waterproofs/warm clothing, lunch and water, and for any personal items needed for the day.

### Trilliums of Ontario

9<sup>th</sup> - 23<sup>rd</sup> May 2011

netween winter snows and summer leaf-burst there's a magical time in Ontario's woodlands - the great spring flower show. The Provincial flower, Trillium grandiflorum, blooms throughout in magnificent stands of white and green, with dark red Trillium erectum, and plentiful yellow Erythroniums. The Bruce Peninsula's limestone alvars are home to Goldthread, Clintonia, Striped Coralroot and Dwarf Lake Irises, whilst exquisite Calypso Orchids nestle amongst the mosses of Flowerpot Island. Tom Thomson's evocative Algonquian landscapes captured what for many is the perfect tranquillity of the Canadian Backwoods, and in these very woods we'll encounter Pitcher Plants, Dicentras, Gaywings, Trailing Arbutus, and fantastic shows of Painted Trilliums. Further south, the waters' tumultuous descent over Niagara Falls is hardly calmed through the deep gorge below. Here forests of the Carolinian realm thrive on the warm slopes and are rich in spring ephemerals such as abundant Trilliums, Twisted-Stalks/Uvularia's and Cucumber-roots, and there's lack-inthe-Pulpits, all sorts of Violets, Foamflowers and stands of lovely Aquilegias. Fauna will include Black Bears and Moose, and everywhere colourful warblers sing amongst some of the finest flowery woodlands in North America.





# Oncocyclus Irises of Turkey & Lebanon 3<sup>rd</sup> - 17<sup>th</sup> May 2011

rises are amongst the world's most beautiful plants and for many the crème de la crème of this genus are the fabulous Oncocyclus. Their improbably large blooms are a feature of some of the Middle-East's finest botanical areas. This tour takes us to strikingly beautiful Lebanon, now again welcoming tourists, where the cedar forests host fantastic purple-lined Iris cedretii, stunning pale Iris lortetii and impressive Iris westii. Elegant Iris sofarana is found on the alpine slopes of ten thousand foot Qurnat as-Sawda and Mount Hermon. Between cedars and maquis on the slopes of Ehden are Komper's Orchid, whilst on the edge of the Great Rift at Yammouneh are Allium libani and Himantoglossum affine.

Moving into Turkey we'll find shapely Iris sprengeri near Nigde before spending nine days moving steadily eastwards visiting populations of variable Iris sari, local Iris kirkwoodii and some magnificent stands of one of the finest of them all, silken Iris gatesii. We finish around gorgeous Lake Van where magnificent Iris iberica is joined by blue Iris barnumae and furry-falled Iris paradoxa. An abundance of superb bulbs en route!







## Pyrenees 10<sup>th</sup> - 23<sup>rd</sup> June 2011

Tor, close to the Andorran border, and in the magnificent 'enchanted mountains' of Aigues Tortes, one of Spain's most beautiful National Parks. Apollos float over carpets of yellow Vitaliana, Viola cornuta, and elegant Snowbells. The two large trumpet gentians/Gentiana acaulis and Gentiana/ alpina offer their magnificent blue trumpets in abundance and we'll see plenty of smaller Gentians too. Four pink Primula species make a fine show along with Polygalas and several fine Sempervivums. Lammergeiers cruise the blue skies while white Pyrenean Saxifrages erupt from cliffs like miniature waterfalls and lovely blue Ramonda myconi forms pretty gardens on wet rockfaces. On the French side we'll explore the magical Cirque de Gavarnie and the Neouvielle, a land of alpine grasslands, crystal clear lakes, forests of Beech and Silver Fir and snow-capped mountains. Ptarmigan and Alpine Accentors inhabit passes where Androsaces and Saxifrages cling tightly to rocks, the former including chamaejasme/villosa/pyrenaica and carnea/subspecies/laggeri/Nigritella austriaca is abundant in meadows with Pulsatillas, Aconitums, Globeflowers and white Ranunculus species.






### Autumn Bulbs of Jordan 24<sup>th</sup> November 2011 - 3<sup>rd</sup> December 2011

orming the eastern margin of the deep rift that descends to over a thousand feet below sea level on the shores of the Dead Sea are the mountains of Western lordan, an area with a rich and distinctive flora set amid stunning landscapes. Surrounding the hilltop villages are terraces which in the cool of the desert winter host abundant bulbous species, most notably Crocuses. We'll see elegant Crocus aleppicus, lots of Crocus hyemalis, newly described Crocus nagabensis and the lovely Crocus moabiticus. We'll visit a number of Jordan's archaeological sites, most of them excellent areas for flowers, and in particular magnificent Petra, one of the world's most superlative historical sites. The beautiful sandstone mountains surrounding Petra are peppered with Biarums as well as Colchicum ritchii and Colchicum heirosolymitana. Delicate Bellevalia desertorum with Androcymbium blooms palaestinum and we'll look for rare Iris postii whilst much commoner are both Crocus cancellatus and Colchicum brachyphyllum.


